From the Teaching Partnership's aspiration to offer an exciting and comprehensive CPD pathway stemmed the **creation of a new CIPD module; Coaching and Mentoring in Professional Practice**. This will lead to a CIPD Level 7 coaching qualification and it has been commissioned by the Teaching Partnership. We anticipate that 20 places will be available for our partners and that the course will commence in late February/early March. This module aims to equip students to mentor and coach fellow professionals at post-registration levels. It promotes critical evaluation of theoretical, professional and policy approaches to mentoring and coaching in professional practice in social work and social care. The knowledge, understanding, values and skills necessary for mentoring and coaching professional practice in social work/care and related settings are examined. Students are assisted to develop strategies and techniques to enhance their skills in coaching and mentoring professional colleagues working in different practice settings. Students are required to mentor or coach a colleague as part of the practicum for this module. If you are interested, please let your Workforce Development Lead know and shortlisting will take place in February.
