### Categories for Developing Together Social Work Awards 2020

Category	Description
Social Worker of the Year (Adults)	This award is open to qualified social workers working for any agency in the Teaching Partnership at any level, including social work academics at Kingston University. This award is for individuals who have made a difference through their outstanding work with/for adults, including innovative and creative social work practice during CV19.
Social Worker of the Year (Children)	This award is open to qualified social workers working for any agency in the Teaching Partnership at any level, including social work academics at Kingston University. This award is for individuals who have made a difference through their outstanding work with/for children and young people, including innovative and creative social work practice during CV19.
Social Work Student of the Year	This award is open to Kingston University social work students who are showing outstanding potential. Nominees must be able to demonstrate how the individual has gone above and beyond what they might have been expected to achieve.
Teaching Consultant of the Year	This award is open to Teaching Consultants who have been involved in the design and delivery of teaching on the BA and Masters in Social Work courses at Kingston University and have shown creative and innovative approaches in enhancing the learning of social work students.
Practice Educator of the Year	This award is open to qualified practice educators working for any agency in the Teaching Partnership who have been involved in teaching, assessing and supervising students. Nominees must be able to demonstrate how the individual has gone above and beyond what they might have been expected to achieve in successfully motivating students to develop their careers.
ASYE Assessor of the Year	This award is open to those who are working for any Teaching Partnership agency and have been involved in teaching, assessing and supervising newly qualified social workers. Nominees must be able to demonstrate how the individual has gone above

NQSW of the Year (Adults)	<p>This award is open to newly qualified social workers working in adult social care within a Teaching Partnership agency who have less than one year's post-qualifying work experience. Nominees must be able to demonstrate how the individual has made a positive difference to the lives of people who use services through their outstanding work, including innovative and creative social work practice during CV19.</p>
NQSW of the Year (Children)	<p>This award is open to newly qualified social workers working in children's social care within a Teaching Partnership agency who have less than one year's post-qualifying work experience. Nominees must be able to demonstrate how the individual has made a positive difference to the lives of people who use services through their outstanding work, including innovative and creative social work practice during CV19.</p>
Team Leader of the Year (Adults)	<p>This award is open to team leaders/managers working in adult social care within a Teaching Partnership agency who have demonstrated outstanding commitment to their role and consistently lead by example, going over and above in supporting their team.</p>
Team Leader of the Year (Children)	<p>This award is open to team leaders/managers working in children's social care within a Teaching Partnership agency who have demonstrated outstanding commitment to their role and consistently lead by example, going over and above in supporting their team.</p>
Outstanding Contribution to supporting Equality & Diversity	<p>This award is open to qualified and non-qualified workers who have developed a career in the social work sector and have become inspirational role models in promoting equality and diversity. This individual should demonstrate a commitment to anti-oppressive and anti-racist practice and social work values.</p>
