About the role

We are looking for experienced registered social workers to work alongside Kingston University module leaders. Together they will co-develop, co-deliver and contribute to teaching within the social work programmes at Kingston University. There are a variety of opportunities to share your skills and knowledge such as lectures, seminars and small groups, skills workshops as well as involvement in recruitment to courses and the development of students' employability.

Teaching Consultants will have an appropriate number of their contracted hours protected by their employer in order to participate in student admissions, produce teaching materials, take part in direct teaching, contribute to research within their specialist field and further embed research in practice. The estimated time commitment to the role is 12 days per annum, based on the commitment of our existing pool of Teaching Consultants who have been in post since late 2018/early 2019.

This is an exciting developmental opportunity to share your skills and knowledge, contribute to the workforce and develop your professional portfolio. We are looking for enthusiastic social workers who wish to join us in collaborative, innovative

curriculum delivery. You will be provided with support and training in preparation for this role and previous candidates have gone on to complete post qualifying modules to consolidate their learning. A number of existing Teaching Consultants have also applied for [Associate Fellowship](#) with the Higher Education Authority.

About you

The successful candidates will;

- have 3 years post-qualifying experience
- be working for one of the Partner organisations
- have experience of supporting and developing practice (ideally supporting learning, delivering workshops or facilitating action learning)
- have support from their line manager, enabling release to the Partnership to carry out the role

Job role requirements

Candidates should be able to demonstrate:

- Experience of enabling learning
- Up to date knowledge of contemporary social work practice
- An understanding of how to link theory to social work practice
- Strong social work ethics and values

We particularly welcome and will prioritise applications from candidates who have practice experience in one or more of the following areas of specialism:

- Child trafficking
- Mental health and substance misuse
- Cultural competence and critical analysis from a variety of perspectives including practitioners from diverse backgrounds
- Contextual safeguarding
- Working in organisations and multi-disciplinary working

Below are other indicative areas we require the Teaching Consultants to contribute towards:

- Report writing
- Communication and interviewing skills
- Direct work with children/adults
- Reflection and critical analysis
- Employability and preparation for ASYE
